

Today, the engines driving the global economy are megaregions that form vast swaths of trade, transportation, innovation and talent — at times spanning national borders. Examples include the Boston-New-York-Washington corridor, the Shanghai-Nanjing-Hangzhou triangle and Arizona-Sonora megaregion.

Inside the Arizona-Sonora megaregion, Arizona State University acts as a catalyst for promoting and strengthening the growing economy in the Greater Phoenix area and beyond. In fiscal year 2020 alone, ASU had an economic impact of \$4.6 billion on the state's gross product.
